Introduction:

The National Museum of Military Vehicles will provide a tour of the museum that incorporates the Wyoming state social studies standard listed above. The purpose of this lesson is to show students how one small change can lead to a much larger change or a large outcome.

Learning Objectives:

- Identify how small changes to the Sherman Tank helped change the outcome of WWII
- Identify how the small change from peacetime to wartime changed the economy.
- Understand how small changes can lead to larger changes in Vietnam

Lesson Overview:

The lesson will begin with students having a discussion about small decisions they made in their lives and how they changed them. We will then get an understanding of prior knowledge and ask students if they can name a time in history when small changes led to bigger changes. If no information is given we will tell them they will be able to name a few after the tour. Large group discussions will engage the students with critical thinking and association with personal lives. In the tour, we will cover Pearl Harbor leading to World War II, the atomic bomb and how it changed science, the Sherman tank to a Jumbo Sherman, the Red Ball Express, and the impact on the front lines.
