### **Introduction:**

### **Learning Objectives:**

- Identify how government contracts during World War II helped with the course of the war.
- Identify how Rosie the Riveter was used as a focal point in the United States industries
- Understanding how the helicopter helped the war effort in Vietnam.

#### **Lesson Overview:**

The lesson will begin with students discussing what technologies in their lives have shaped who they are today. This will promote the association with the topic we will be discussing for the length of the tour. We will begin in the galleries when the group has covered events and how they change outcomes. We will first discuss the industrialization of the United States after Pearl Harbor and how it changed American society and the military. At the end of the Puller gallery, we will wrap up by revisiting the Truman Doctrine and its impact on the Korean War as well as the Vietnam War.
